# 2009

2009 was a challenging year for many ministries, however, in spite of perilous economic times God has been faithful to our Fellowship, and has enabled us to continue to extend grace and ignite hope in communities around the world. This report will highlight a number of the activities of this past year.

**Church Planting:** In 2008, we established the \$2 million Daniel and Helen Breen Memorial Church Planting Endowment Fund, for church planting in Canada. In 2009, through additional donations, the Endowment Fund grew by nearly \$25,000. Because of the blessing of God and prudent financial management, the Breen Endowment Fund generated \$40,000 towards church planting activities in 2009, and we are planning to invest an additional \$75,000 in church planting in 2010.

In 2009, we partnered with Life Church in St. Albert, Alberta in preparing to plant a new church in South Edmonton. We invested money in church planter training and development, and we were also able to sponsor a number of pastors and church leaders to attend The Canadian Church Planting Congress in Calgary in November of 2009.

**Re-Branding:** In 2008, the Board of Trustees undertook a process of reviewing the vision and mission of the Apostolic Church of Pentecost of Canada. From that process, new vision and mission statements were developed and a new tag line was created. In 2009 the process continued with a leadership survey, resulting in the review and restatement of core values. The final step in this process was to develop a logo and visual image that would reflect the vision, mission and core values of ACOP.

**EPIC:** EPIC is an in-service leadership development program for ACOP Pastors. In May of 2009, 25 ACOP Pastors met in Edmonton for three days of Leadership Development. Two days were spent in an inter-denominational learning context as we joined with our brothers and sisters from the **Christian and Missionary Alliance, Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada** and the **Fellowship of Christian Assemblies** to hear author and speaker, Alan Hirsch. The third day was spent in interactive discussion focused on missional effectiveness.

**Missions Division:** In 2009, the missions division conducted an extensive review of ACOP's missions program. The mission committee is working towards a ministry model that will give local churches a stronger level of ownership in ACOP Missions.

In August the missions committee convened a special consultation with a number of missionaries who were home on furlough. Over 20 missionaries and mission committee members met in Calgary for a day and a half of fellowship, reporting, debriefing, and personal ministry.

Over the past 15 years, many ACOP members have ministered among the Bethel Churches of Cuba, and several Cuban pastors have ministered in Canada. In 2009, ACOP and Bethel formalized this relationship by developing a strategic partnership to facilitate the exchange of ministries between our two Fellowships.

Our Orphan Care ministry, which is part of our HIV/AIDS Initiative, continues to grow. There are now 10 orphan care centers in South Central Africa.

Our Humanitarian Aid Fund enabled us to respond to humanitarian needs in Malawi, Congo, Burundi, Burkina Faso, Zimbabwe, and El Salvador this past year. In total, \$40,000 was provided for emergency aid and disaster relief.

The Global Harvest Endowment Fund continues to be an important source of funding for ACOP Missionaries. First-term missionaries are able to access the Fund for airfare, set-up costs, vehicle, and equipment purchases. The fund also assists all missionaries with professional development and conference attendance.

**Apostolic Youth Ministry:** AYM continues to serve as a resource to local churches and a sponsor of numerous youth ministry programs, including Street Invaders, LifeForce, Young Leaders Conference, Youth Workers Seminar, and Legacy One.

AYM has also added AYM Creative – a design firm that not only provides graphic design and media support for AYM, but also generates income for AYM by offering design services to other churches and ministries. 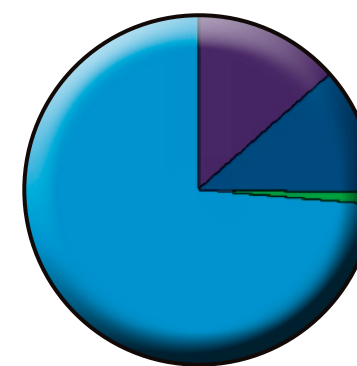

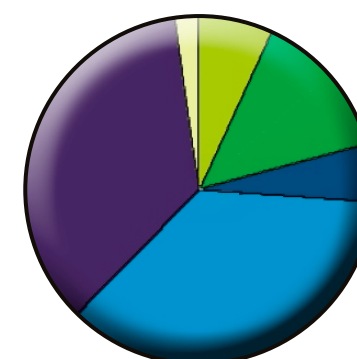
