

Missionary Prayer Connection

I have been a missionary in Africa since 1982. I spent three years in Malawi and the rest of the time here in Burkina Faso. I came to work with children as that is the passion of my heart but realized that if I teach children only a few will be taught so I've been training others to teach children. Pascal was saved 17 yr. ago as he translated for me in a children's meeting and today he is our national president of the children's department, we have 8 leaders or superintendents of S.S. teachers in their districts and in total 110 S.S. teachers.

Four times a year we have a week-long training for our district leaders of S.S. teachers and it is a joy and privilege to be with them. These men give so much of themselves to train their teachers. May 4-12th in Leo we had with us Kidzana - an organization from the United States

who train children's workers. We expected 30 people-district superintendents with their regional executive committees for a week of training.

I teach at our Bible School in Leo and this past year we've had 24 students, May 15th was their grad so it was a month that was busy with finishing teaching courses and correcting exams. I love to teach them and I thank God for the privilege to be here and the contact I have with them. Pascal and I teach child evangelism at the school and Thursday afternoons we have approx. 80 children, this is also a practical ministry for our students. Two weeks ago 20 children accepted Christ as their Saviour, to God be the glory. It is too easy to get bogged down with administration and problems so their conversions reminded me again of why I'm here. Pascal baptized 21 young men (14-21 yr. old) in water-two of these children we're taught since they were four years old so again we praise God for them...what a joy to see them consecrate their lives to God.

I am the only ACOP missionary here now which means my ministry has changed; and involves communication with Canada about mission business, with visitors who come to teach in our Bible School or other ministries, meetings in my home with the Bible School committee or national or regional committee meetings for our children's department.

There always seem to be lots to do; I covet your prayer for wisdom as I deal with these different avenues of ministry, to know priorities for each day and to have His Anointing as I teach, speak or give guidance to others.

I left Burkina May 24th to be in Canada for four months; I look forward to seeing many of you at conference and while I'm at home.

Thanks so much for your faithful support, prayerfully, financially, your love and encouragement that you show towards me. I treasure you and thank God for you - co-laborers together with Him in Burkina Faso. God bless!
