ACOP MISSIONARY

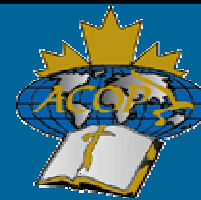

I grew up in a Christian family surrounded by love and God’s word. I accepted Christ when I was 4 years old at Moose Lake Camp with the assistance of my brother, and even at that young age I knew that what I was doing was important. Each summer my highlight was being able to spend a month or more at Cowichan River Bible Camp

where I continued to grow in my knowledge of God. I went on my first mission’s trip at the age of 12 years old where I along with about 9 other people went to northern Vancouver Island and worked with children in Uclulet and Tofino. When I was there God gave me a vision of children’s faces in India, I had no idea what it meant, but I held on to that picture. About the time I was 16 years I heard a missionary from India speak of the work he was doing there. He told stories that seemed beyond belief, terrifying events, narrow escapes and life threatening situations. Normally I was a more timid person, but after he finished his talk I knew that I was supposed to go to India some time in my life. After high school I went to FGBI and by many miraculous events, there was a trip to India planned for that summer. I knew that this was my time! I went there for 5 weeks, and it was a fulfillment of so many things in my life, but most of all, my heart for missions kept growing. I continued on in Bible School and through one of our Missions weekends met Jerry and Brenda Schuetz. Within the span of about an hour, I had committed to going to Zambia to work at the Heart of Africa Mission for a one year internship. I learned who I was and most importantly, who God wanted me to be during that year. I saw God in a way I had never known Him and I felt as though I was home. The vision and ministry in Zambia was so similar to my own, and I developed a passion for training and equipping National leadership. My internship ended and I took some time to really seek God and to see where He wanted me to be, and 4 years after I left I was back in Zambia as a full time missionary.
